



Questions (1)

There are four ways to construct normal questions in English. We have already seen the first: **Va + S + Vp + O + C?**

The second type is used when we are not 100% sure of something and need confirmation, this type is called: Question Tags:
S + Vp + O + C, Va [with the opposite sense +/- than in the main part] + S [pronoun] + ?

John eats pasta every day, doesn't he?

John is eating pasta now, isn't he?

John does not eat pasta every day, does he?

The third type of interrogative is when we do not have some information, this could be the object or the complement (see Question Words).

Q = Question Word

Q + Va + S + Vp + [O + C]

In the sentence: *John eats pasta every day*. We have both a direct object, the pasta, and a complement of time, every day, so, it is possible to have two questions:

What does John eat every day?

When does John eat pasta?
