**T**he fourth type of interrogative is when we do not know the subject, this could be a person, animal or thing, the form is:

**Q + Vp + O + C**

**H**ere you can see that there is no inversion of Va with the S as we do not know the subject we cannot use an auxiliary [if there is already an auxiliary in the affirmative this will still be use in its original position]

*John eats pasta every day.*  
*Who eats pasta every day?*

*John is eating pasta now.*  
*Who is eating pasta now?*

*My car is in the car park.*  
*What is in the car park?*
