



Adjectives

All adjectives are placed before the noun so that where a word indicates that it needs a noun we must go to the last word, a full stop, subject, verb, pronoun can block us and we then have the noun.

E.g., I was walking along the road when I saw a new long red plastic Italian car that was parked by the bank.

*I was walking along the road when I saw **a** new long red plastic Italian car that was parked by the bank.*

Here is an article, it needs a noun, where is it?

I was walking along the road when I saw *a new long red plastic Italian car* **that** was parked by the bank.

Here is a relative pronoun that stops the list of adjectives and nouns so that the word before is the last and thus the noun we need.

*I was walking along the road when I saw a new long red plastic Italian **car** that was parked by the bank.*

We now have **a car** all the other words are adjectives describing the type of car:

a new car
a long car
a red car
a plastic car
an Italian car

(see hyphen).
