

## For and Since

**For** is used to express a period of time.

I worked there for two years, from 1980 to 1982

I have been waiting here for two hours, from 2 p.m. to now.

I will be away for three weeks, from tomorrow.

**Since** is used to express the beginning of the period and that period finishes, or completes a given period, to eventually continue into the future.

I have been here since 9 a.m.

I have lived in this town since 1980

Since always uses the Present Perfect tense.

Now	
For: this is a period that ends now!	
Since: we only have the start of the period
