

Present Tense

The form is : $S + Vp^2$

 $R_{\text{emember that the }3^{\text{rd}}}$ person singular takes the "S".

We use the **Present Tense** to describe a **HABIT**, normally it is not happening now and we normally say when it happens. Thus we can say:

 $Present\ Tense = Habit,\ not\ now + when$

I sleep every night.
You visit me once a year.
He works in the morning.
She plays the violin in her spare time.
We do the shopping on Saturday

We live in London

She plays the piano

In these two sentences we have the **Present Tense** but when it is not specified, this means **ALWAYS**, our house where we *always* live is in London.

She *always* plays the piano, this is her job, a piano player.
