



# Future Tense

The form is : **S + will+ V<sub>p1</sub>-To**

The Future tense (or Simple Future Tense) is used to express an action that will happen in the future, it could be one second or ten years. It generally indicates that it is a continuation of actions that have already taken place in the past, that is to say that it is "normal".

This tense is compared to the Strong Future and can replace it when the people who are speaking know the events and can distinguish between normal and not normal actions.

Examples:

- i) I will work tomorrow (I work every day so it is normal for me to work tomorrow).
- ii) On Sunday I will not work (I do not normally work on Sunday).
- iii) In the summer I will go to Rome (I normally always go to Rome in the summer).
- iv) (Speaking to my mother) I will not go to work tomorrow. (Here my mother knows me and what I normally do or do not do and therefore she understands if the action is normal or not for me).
