- \bullet Must gives the indication of an imperative, it is almost an order, the person speaking wants the action to happen.
- Have/has to has a very similar meaning to Must but the person speaking does not necessarily want the action to happen, the speaker is only communicating something dictated by someone, or something, else.
- Should is used to indicate general advice, it can be in any moment, there is no immediate consequence.
- Had better is similar to should, but it indicates that there is an immediate, or probable, consequence, normally negative.
